Description of Services

The Certifier will perform all work necessary to comply with relevant statutory requirements, including –

- Inspecting the swimming pool
- Assessing whether the swimming pool complies with the requirements of the issue of a certificate of compliance under S.22D of the SP Act
- Issuing a certificate of compliance to the Client if the swimming pool complies
- Issuing the following if the swimming pool is non-compliance
 - (a) written notice under section 22E of the SP Act, and
 - (b) a certificate of non-compliance within seven days of the date of inspection
- Providing a copy of the section 22E written notice to the relevant local council
 - (a) immediately where, in the opinion of the Certifier, the pool poses a significant risk to public safety, or
 - (b) within five days after the expiry of six weeks from the date of inspection unless a certificate of compliance is issued beforehand.
- At owners request, re-inspecting the swimming pool, and issuing certificates and/or written notices, as appropriate
- Updating the property record on the NSW Swimming Pool Register, as required.
